FINANCING YOUR LEGAL EDUCATION

Your decision to pursue law school is significant. Our goal is to provide knowledge and resources that will help you finance your degree wisely and strategically. Not only do we want you to be well-prepared for the financial obligation of law school, but also positioned for success when you begin your career.

FEDERAL AID

Regent Law students are awarded a blend of academic scholarships and federal aid to fund their law school education. To be considered for federal aid you must complete the FAFSA (FAFSA.org).

Be sure to include **Regent's FAFSA School Code: 030913**.

PRIMARY LOAN OPTIONS

Stafford Loans – Graduate students may be eligible for up to \$20,500 per academic year.

Graduate PLUS – This loan type offers lower interest rates than most private education loans.

AWARDS & GRANTS

Merit-Based Scholarships – All academic scholarships for incoming students are awarded during the admissions process. Scholarships are highly competitive and granted to admitted students on a rolling basis. If awarded a scholarship, you will receive an award letter concurrent to your admission decision.

Restricted and Endowed Scholarships – Scholarship opportunities available to 2L and 3L students are sent directly to your Regent email address. Applications are typically available in June. Students who have less than full-tuition scholarships are eligible to apply for further opportunities.

Special Consideration Scholarships – Scholarship opportunities may be sponsored by groups such as Church of God in Christ (COGIC), Black Law Students Association (BLSA), and the Hispanic Law Students Association (HLSA). Scholarships are also available for first-generation students.

Military Benefits & Aid

REGENT.EDU/MILITARY

Regent is situated within the Hampton Roads area, which is home to nine major military installations, including the world’s largest naval base. Regent Law is pleased to offer these key benefits to our military community:

A **25% tuition discount** to active-duty military and veterans, and a **15% tuition discount** to military spouses and dependents.

The **Tuition Assistance** program, provided by the federal government, assists military in pursuit of higher education.

Degree opportunities for candidates for military **Judge Advocate General’s Corps**. JAG students are positioned to become licensed attorneys while serving in active duty.

Partnership with the Post-9/11 **G.I. Bill®** program for education and housing to individuals with at least 90 days of aggregate service after September 10, 2001. The G.I. Bill also applies to individuals discharged with a service-connected disability after 30 days. You must have received an honorable discharge to be eligible.

Partnership with the Veterans Affairs (VA) Administration to offer the **Yellow Ribbon Program** Scholarship to students with 100% eligibility under the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill®.



*Military tuition discounts cannot be combined with merit-based scholarships—the larger scholarship or discount will be applied to the student’s account, but not both. “GI Bill®” is a registered trademark of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). BEFORE YOU BORROW

Make a budget. Borrow the lowest amount you need to pay for school.

Live as frugally as possible. Purchase used books, live with a roommate, carpool, and limit eating out.

Remember that every dollar borrowed could easily cost you two dollars by the time you pay it back.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

Keep in mind that the law school that gives you the most aid may not have the best overall offer. Your aid amount may be higher because the costs are higher, all costs are not included, or the award is mostly loan-based.

As you weigh law schools, consider these questions:

- Do the school’s values align with mine?
- What is the atmosphere on campus?
- Is the scholarship dependent upon maintaining a certain GPA, class rank, etc.?
- What is the school’s bar passage rate?
- What is the school’s median LSAT and GPA?
- Is the location of the school a good fit for me?
- How much interaction is there between faculty and students?
