### General Notes

- Check Degree Works or the Catalog for course pre-requisite information.
- Minimum C- grade for major coursework required
- 50% of major requirements must be taken at Regent University
- A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to maintain good academic standing.
- Some majors also require a minimum grade in all major courses.
- As a general rule, 100 and 200 level courses should be taken prior to upper level (300 and 400) level courses.
- A minimum of 120 credits is required.
- A minor may be completed in place of a portion of the general electives. Students must still earn 120 credits total.
- Honors & on campus students will have 15 less general elective credits due to taking the C&C minor or Honors courses.

### Major Related Notes

- All 300-400-level HIST courses have a prerequisite of any 200-level course.
- HIST 401 has a prerequisite of any 300-level HIST course.
- HIST 497 has a prerequisite of HIST 401.
- Only one Independent Study course (HIST 390 or 490) and/or one Special Topics course (HIST 485) may be used to satisfy the thirty (30) credit hour American/European History requirement.
- HIST 495 (Internship) does not meet any History major requirements.
