#### **Graduation Requirements**

Complete 67+ credit hours.

Degree must be completed within 7 years.

Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00.

Students are required to receive a B or better in all courses.

The limit for the number of credits accepted by Advanced Standing and transfer is forty-nine percent of total degree requirements.

#### Notes

- <sup>1</sup> Students are required to register for GOV 700 in their first semester. This course coincides with the first summer residency.
- <sup>2</sup> Required to take during the student's first Fall semester.
- <sup>3</sup> Required to take during the student's first Spring semester.
- <sup>4</sup> Student must complete all coursework before taking the comprhensive exams. Exams are on-campus.
