Spiritual Life Student Organization Policies & Event Guidelines

Student Engagement and Campus Ministries

- The President and Vice President must attend monthly Campus Ministries Campus
 Leader Collective meetings (occurring on the first Mondays of every month at noon).
 These meetings provide essential training and create space for fellowship with other spiritual life student leaders on campus. Attendance of these meetings is strongly encouraged for other officers.
- Faculty/staff advisors for spiritual life student organizations must attend Spiritual life
 Advisor training meetings with Regent's Campus Ministries department, twice per year.
- Each officer must agree to the Regent University Statement of Faith
- Spiritual life student organizations must consult with the director of Campus Ministries prior to making plans for **administering sacraments** at any event or meeting.
- Spiritual life student organizations cannot hold events that conflict with Campus Ministries programs or local church services. Specifically, organizations may not schedule:
 - Sunday morning meetings (conflicts with local church services)
 - Tuesday evenings, 7-9pm (conflicts with Connect Groups)
 - Wednesdays, 11:30am-1pm (conflicts with University Chapel)
 - Thursday evenings after 5pm (conflicts with UnChapel)
 - Any formal or recurring worship services that would replace church attendance or Campus Ministries events
 - The goal is to support—not compete with—existing worship opportunities on campus and in the local community.
- Spiritual life student organizations are prohibited from organizing **scheduled exorcisms** on campus.
- All events and speakers are subject to screening and approval by Student Engagement and Campus Ministries.
- Spiritual life student organizations are prohibited from inviting non-students and external guests (including local ministers) into meetings held within Regent University housing and living quarters. Rather, spiritual life organizations must meet in public spaces when non-student guests and ministers are invited to attend.
- Spiritual life student organizations agree to treat all with kindness and respect, even
 when traditions differ, and to refrain from participating in any disrespectful or
 confrontational conversations with students, faculty, staff, or fellow ministries about
 theological differences.
